The National Assembly's impeachment motion against Yoon accuses the president of violating the Con-stitution and laws by declaring martial law in the absence of a national emergency and ignoring due proceemergency and ignoring due proce-dures, such as holding a Cabinet meeting and notifying parliament. Yoon has argued his declaration of martial law was an act of gover-nance meant to send a warning to the opposition party over its re-peated impeachments of govern-ment officials and attempts to cut the budget.

The report revealed that the sophisticated AI models from Microsoft and Open AI had been used in Israel's military actions in Gaza. These

The BJP's accusations go deeper, pointing to an alleged nexus between law enforcement, local administration, and organized crime syndicates, where political patronage ensures that only small-scale cultivators face action while major players remain untouched.

Rat miners reach last point of the Srisailam tunnel but find no trace of trapped men

Hyderabad, Feb 26: A 20-member rescue team com-prising rat miners and NDRF and SDRF personnel was, though able to reach the last point of the Sri-sailam Left Bank Canal (SLBC)

It was the rat miners with simple tools without much safety gear who were able to reach the last critical 50 metres of the 14 km long SLBC tunnel in search of the eight men on the night of day four. showed the challenges they faced, snowed the challenges they faced, particularly due to reduced oxygen levels inside the tunnel. Munna Qureshi, one of the rat miners, pointed out that this was far more challenging than the Uttarakhand tunnel where the team had rescued

more than 41 people trapped inside.

He said the situation was very critical at the accident spot as the tunnel was very unstable. "We cannot take a risk with the lives of the rescuers. Right now, the debris is holding up but once we start re-

moving it to look for the men, it can be very critical and everything can come down. So, we are going to find the men and bring them out but we first need to seal the roof and we first need to seal the roof and stabilize the structure. There will be three to four teams working in tan-dem. We will start once the collector sir gives us the go-ahead," said Qureshi.

He said water was still steadily

He said water was still steadily seeping in the tunnel in spite of the continuous dewatering.

The unified command overseeing the rescue work also saw Border Roads Organisation joining in to suggest ways to stabilise the tunnel. Mumbai, Feb 26:
A Bombay High Court bench comprising Justices BP Co-labawalla and Firosh Pooniwalla stated on Wednesday that its ruling will be limited to only whether the show cause notice (SCN) issued by the customs authorities to Skoda Auto Volkswagen India is time-barred or not.
Earlier, Volkswagen's lawyer Arvind Datar had argued that the customs duty demand of USD 1.4 billion is a matter of "life and death for us", which meant that it could make survival difficult for the company in India. Datar criticised the

make survival difficult for the com-pany in India. Datar criticised the 1.4 billion USD (approximately Rs 12,000 crore) demand as "unrea-sonable", questioning how the company could be expected to pay such a sum after more than a decade of consistent classifications.



After six days of extensive argu-ments, the bench stated that its rul-ing will be limited only to whether the show cause notice issued by the Customs authorities against the au-tomotive company was time-burged.

"Although we have heard exten sively on all the issues, we will pass orders only on the issue of limita-tion," the court stated. It also indi-

cated that even if the petition filed by the German auto giant is al-lowed and the court decides against the customs authorities, they are free to take action under Section 28 of the Customs Act for suppression of facts. The court granted customs authorities time until March 10 to file their reply on certain factual as-pects, particularly Volkswagen's claim that no communications were

made before 2023 requesting fur-ther documents. Volkswagen has blamed Customs authorities for taking as long as 12 years to review some shipment records, but cus-toms authorities stated that the investigation was delayed because the company did not provide necessary documents on time. Volk-swagen's lawyer Arvind Datar also swagen's lawyer Arvind Datar also argued the customs duty demand is contradictory to Indian tax rules on imports of car parts. Government lawyers and Volkswagen lawyers presented arguments in court hearings about how imports should be classified. Last week, Additional Solicitor General N Venkataraman had told Volkswagen's lawyer Arvind Datar in court, "Don't be the victim here. If you don't follow the law then we will initiate action."
