journey Onboard the orbital laboratory, the Axiom-4 mission crew comprising Shukla, commander Peggy Whitson, and mission specialists Slawosz Uznanski-Wisniewski of Poland and Ti bor Kapu of Hungary spent the next 18 days conducting 60 experiments and 20 outreach sessi

Travelling at a speed of over 28,000 km per hour, the Dragon spacecraft, carrying the Axion-4 crew members, executed a series of manoeuvres to gradually slow down and enter the Earth's atmosphere, braving intense heat before a splashdown in the Pacific Ocean.

Minutes later, the Dragon spacecraft was hauled up over SpaceX's recovery ship 'Shannon', where Shukla and the other astronauts emerged from the spacecraft, smiling and waving at the cameras

The astronauts were helped by the ground staff to get on their feet as they adapted to gravity on Earth after es encing weightless conditions during their 20-day trip. Soon after Shukla returned from the space odyssey, Prime

Minister Narendra Modi said, "I join the nation in welcoming Group Captain Shubhanshu Shukla as he returns to Earth from his historic mission to Space." The astronaut's part who watched the splashdown in Lucknow, heaved a sight of relief as their son returned to Earth. While Shukla's father, Shambhu Daval Shukla, and mother Asha Devi wiped thei tears his sister Suchi Misra, welcomed her brother's landing

with moist eyes and folded hands. "He has been to space and back, and we are all over the moon because this mission has its own importance for the country's Gaganyaan programme," Shambhu Dayal Shukla said

ISRO had invested Rs 550 crore for the spaceflight, and the learnings from the mission are expected to help India fulfil its own human spaceflight ambitions - the Gaganyaan project, which is eveing a 2027 lift-off.

The prime minister said that as India's first astronaut to have visited the International Space Station, Shukla has inspired a billion dreams through his dedication, courage and pioneering spirit.

"It marks another milestone towards our own Human Spac Flight Mission – Gaganyaan," Modi said in a post on X. The Axiom-4 crew underwent a series of medical checks board the ship before boarding a helicopter for a ride back to

the shore. The four astronauts are expected to spend seven days in reha bilitation as they adjust back to life on Earth under the influ ence of gravity, unlike the weightlessness experienced in

Biofuels in India: Opportunities and Challenges

India produces more than 25 million tonnes of used cooking oil and agricul tural residue every year, much of which is either wasted or contributes to envi is either wasted or contributes to envi-ronmental pollution. FSSAI mandates that Food business operators in India must not reuse the cooking oil beyond a total polar com-pound limit of 25 per cent — used genpound limit of 25 per cent — used gen-erally for not more than three times. After this oil is to be discarded.

India consumes about 27 billion litres India consumes about 27 billion litres of cooking oil annually, and out of this 1.4 billion litres of used oil can be col-lected and processed to make biodicsel. Presently the enforcement of the FSSAI guidelines for reuse of cooking oil is very weak. There is a complete oil is very weak. There is a complete lack of awareness amongst shopkeep-ers and the grass-root enforcement agency hardly show any interest in reg-ulatory compliance. Today, the used oil by large

hotel/restaurant is taken by agents, who then sell it to the small vendors or mix with other oil and sell to households-mainly the poor families. Such an arrangement is not only

defeating the very purpose of the FSSAI regulation but also affecting the health of such person who are eating products made out of such used oil and these are largely the poor families. Enforcement of the FSSAI regulation is therefore critical for the emergence of the sector promoting production of bio diesel from used oil. Issues in collection of used oil

The other challenge is lack of infrastructure for collection of the used oil from the various food establishment and households. In some cases the used oil especially in case of household is thrown in the drain further lending into the river and other water bodies.

This affects the biodiversity of the water bodies to a great extant. The used oil from the food outlet along the River Ganga does affect the biodiversity of the revered River. Similar is the case with other rivers and rivulets in India. An organised collection process sup-

ported by awareness, enforcement and incentive is necessary for a long term and sustainable solution to me et the challenges of pollution and other health hazard caused by used oil and enabling exploration of the potential for conver sion to bio diesel.

taries also contributed valuable suggestions to enhance the overall security of IT assets and prevent data breaches

The Secretary, IT, Dr. Piyush Singla took this occasion to provide a comprehensive presenta-tion detailing the safety that to expedie the secu-rity audit process, the TPA has been requested to engage four additional re-sources, with the audit of all pending websites ex-pected to be completed within the next two months. Regular follow-ups with CISOs/ISOs is done by the Department and detailed reports are being shared with all Ad-ministrative Secretaries for their appraisal. Regarding other de-partmental measures, it was reported that End-point Detection and Re-sponse (EDR) deploy-ment is underway at the Civil Secretariat in Jammu and Stringar, with 4011 EDR and 1789 UEM installations completed. and security precaution-ary measures undertaken by the department to en-sure the cyber security of all government websites and assets. He informed the meeting that an audit agency has been engaged to conduct security audits of websites/portals hosted

of websitesprinationated at the 1&K SDC. Dr. Singla highlighted the current status of web-sites hosted at the J&K SDC. He gave out that of a total of 239 websites, 140 are live. Of the 99 non-live websites, 70 are cur-rently under audit by a Third-Party Auditor (TPA), 11 are under de-partmental audit, 10 are yet to be audited but are

covered under the audit plan, 6 more have been al-located for auditing but their staging is not ready, and 2 websites have been decommissioned till date He further informed that to expedite the secu-rity audit process, the

VPN access has been stricted to users Multi-Factor Authen Multi-Fa tion (MFA), and all routers have been configrouters have been config-ured to accept requests only from India. Further-more, Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) have been mandated for open-ing IP/Ports via firewalls only
